Our pedagogical approach is rooted in the science of how we learn. It is based on robust educational research.

- We ask lots of questions. This moves knowledge from working memory to long term memory.
- Our spaced practice reduces forgetting time. We know that anything that need to be remembered, needs to periodically recalled from memory.
- We explain in small steps due to the limitations of working memory
- We model extensively to allow pupils to observe expert thinking
- We link to prior learning because we know that pupils understand best when they can link to what they already know
- We guide first practice to ensure that misconceptions are rectified
- Our pupils think hard, memory is the residue of thought.
- We focus on next steps. This means that pupils are learning exactly what they need to learn at the right time. This is real differentiation. We target pupils that need further support.
- Our learning experiences are memorable with sparkle that engages our pupils.
- We have very high expectations.

TRANSITION FROM YEAR 11 PONTIO O FLWYDDYN 11

Post-16 study is demanding, challenging, and inspiring. To help aid transition we have a calendared programme of events including a Taster Day, Open Evening, and an interview with a senior member of staff to discuss subject options. As part of the options process, all pupils applying to the Sixth Form will also receive an interview the day after they receive their GCSE results in August. The focus of the interview is to reflect on pupils' potential options and their commitment to Post-16 study.

RESULTS CANLYNIADAU

Provision at King Henry VIII 3-19 school is of a very high standard. Pupil outcomes have been consistently very high. In August 2023 the number of pupils achieving the level 3 threshold was 97%. 27% of pupils achieved 3 or more A* or A grades. As a result, a high proportion of our pupils gained entry onto the degree courses or apprenticeships of their choice.



We encourage all our pupils to become involved in a range of extra-curricular activities, giving pupils the opportunity to develop a wide range of skills from team work to problem solving and many more.

We value and place a lot of emphasis on Performing Arts. It is important to us that the sounds of music fill the corridor. Music can change the world, it is great for our brains and research tells us how it can help in all other areas of learning. The Performing Arts contribute to the sense of belonging and community, so important for a successful school and Senior Phase. We have thriving choirs and bands. Every year there is an annual production which our Senior Phase pupils play a key role in.

SPORT CHWARAEON

We have active sports teams in the Senior Phase, covering sports such as football, rugby, hockey, and netball, with fixtures arranged over the academic year. Pupils are also encouraged to develop their leadership skills by becoming officials and coaches for younger year groups. We also believe exercise is an important part of being fit and healthy, and encourage our pupils to exercise through our dedicated PE provision. Pupils are encouraged to let us know what they would like to do in these lessons, from yoga to taking part in a spin class.

We believe that providing varied and interesting opportunities for curricular enrichment allows pupils to place in context the learning from the classroom. We have many exciting trips, including a Geography trip to Liverpool, a Humanities trip to the Houses of Parliament, and an Art trip to the National Gallery. There is also an annual trip to the UCAS conference which gives pupils the chance to look at potential universities and courses. There is also the exciting opportunity to go to Honduras with Operation Wallacea.

PALs

Pupils are given the opportunity to volunteer as PALS where pupils are assigned in pairs to Years 7 and 8 tutor groups. Their duties include giving social and academic advice to younger pupils, as well as assisting as reading buddies and wellbeing ambassadors.


We understand and value the importance of strong links between home and school. We have a dedicated Sixth Form team who will keep you informed of progress and be available to help with any queries you may have. We will keep you informed of attendance, progress, and attainment through the following:

- Interim reports giving professional predictions of final grades against target grades.
- Review sessions where pupils will consider predicted grades, reflecting on their progress. Academic mentors will then provide further support.
- A written report.
- A Parents' Evening where you will have an opportunity to talk to staff, discussing targets and progress. We see this as a key element of our support for pupils.

PUPIL SUPPORT

CYNNAL DISGYBLION

All pupils matter and we understand that there will be pupils with differing needs, and that these may change over time. Pupils with additional learning needs are supported by our dedicated transition officer who ensures that we consider what our pupils need and how best to support them. We also have a Senior Phase Wellbeing and Learning Support Officer who oversees key aspects of pupils' wellbeing.

STRETCH AND CHALLENGE

YMESTYN A HERIO

The Seren Network is a project funded by the Welsh Government and run by the Education Advisory Service (EAS) in collaboration with the Sutton Trust 30 group of universities. Its aim is to increase the number of A*/A grades and the number of successful applications to Sutton Trust 30 universities from learners in South East Wales. The programme includes academic staff from universities giving master classes in their subjects, and offering specific support on the application process. This includes how to write an outstanding personal statement and advice on interviews.

Enrolment on this project is administered by the EAS and based on GCSE results and the recommendation of the school. Any pupil who attains six or more A* grades will automatically gain a place and any pupil who gains 5 or more A* grades will be considered.

DESTINATION PLANNING

CYNLLUNIO CYRCHFAN

We have an experienced team comprised of our Destinations Coordinator and Academic Mentors, who prepare learners for the next stage of their education or training. This involves enrolment on Unifrog, a website which allows learners to look at different options after Sixth Form, covering both apprenticeships and university options. Pupils are encouraged to complete online courses in areas they are interested in.

We have close links with Aberystwyth and Bristol Universities who come to talk to our pupils, supporting them in considering next steps. Pupils will have the opportunity to attend the UCAS convention which is attended by all the higher education providers in the UK. Representatives from Student Finance Wales will visit the school to explain the process of applying for student finance.
