Statement on the use of Welsh Language

Welsh is taught as a second language to all pupils in all year groups across the all-age school, apart from those pupils who join in Years 10 and 11 from a school outside Wales, and have no prior learning of Welsh. This ensures the sequential and systematic development of Welsh skills from Reception to Year 11. The school also works with the Cluster to ensure continuity of learning in Welsh when transferring to our school from other primary schools.

The School development Plan includes strategies and actions to support the acquisition of Welsh across the school. The school does not have provision for pupils to receive their education solely through the medium of Welsh.

Religion, Values, and Ethics Education

Religion, Values and Ethics (RVE) is a statutory requirement of the Curriculum for Wales and is mandatory for all pupils from ages 3 to 16. Religious Education is available to all pupils in King Henry VIII 3-19 School. Parents and carers do not have the right to withdraw their children from this subject in Wales. RVE covers a broad study of both religious and non-religious philosophical convictions. In our school pupils learn about the traditions of main world religions, including Christianity, Islam, Hinduism, Sikhism, Buddhism, and Judaism, and the non-religious philosophical viewpoints, including humanism. There is a focus on ethical thinking, personal values, and social responsibility. The subject is taught with neutrality where an objective and pluralistic mindset is encouraged. This is in line with Curriculum for Wales and Monmouthshire guidelines. RVE skills taught are [available here](#).

Collective Worship

The school has a programme of collective worship for all pupils. This takes place via Form Time activities, Phase assemblies, Year assemblies, and Form assemblies. Parents and Carers have the right to withdraw their child from acts of collective worship and do so by contacting the Headteacher, in these cases alternative provision is provided. In our school Collective Worship is a daily act intended to give pupils a space for spiritual reflection. It has a broadly Christian character, and allows pupils to reflect on moral qualities, shared values, and spiritual development.

Provision of toilet facilities

In the Primary Phase there are 32 toilet facilities for pupils and five additional accessible toilets. The toilets are assigned to different year groups and are available in their year group areas. In the Secondary Phase there are 68 toilet facilities for pupils and ten additional accessible toilets. These are located around the school. There is one welfare/medical room.

Cleaning arrangements

Our school maintains a daily cleaning provision ensuring that high touch surfaces and toilet areas are as hygienic as possible. The site is fully cleaned at the end of every day from 3pm. The school site is cleaned by ATLAS. Daily checking of cleanliness takes place every morning when the school is opened, and every evening when the school is locked. This is completed by the Site Team. Further cleaning checks are completed during the day by Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and the Site Team. If further cleaning is required, the Site Team will complete this emergency cleaning. The site has bespoke daily cleaning of high contact areas during the day to ensure the facilities are clean and appropriate for use. We promote good room ventilation to help move germs out.

Promotion of healthy eating and drinking

The school ensures that food served meets the Nutritional standards. This includes plenty of vegetables, plenty of unrefined starchy foods, some meat, fish, eggs, beans and other non-dairy sources of protein, some milk and dairy foods, and only a small amount of food and drink high in fat, sugar and salt. We are committed to ensuring that eating in school is a pleasurable experience, and that the food looks good and tastes good. School lunch is free of charge for Primary Phase pupils. Drinking water is available free of charge for all. All reasonable steps are taken to identify Secondary Phase pupils eligible for free school meals, and these families are encouraged to take these meals. Pupils are not allowed to bring unhealthy drinks into school, including sugary, caffeinated, and energy drinks. The school provides a comprehensive health and wellbeing curriculum to help pupils understand that a healthy balanced diet and physical activity will affect their physical health and wellbeing, and that this links to mental health and emotional wellbeing. This is taught through PSE, Science, Design Technology and PE. Pupils are taught to understand the relationship between food, physical activity and the short- and long-term health benefits. A healthy breakfast is available for all Primary Phase pupils before the start of the school day, this is free of charge.
