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Swimming

Dosbarth Jagwar (Years 5/6 Mrs Taylor and Mrs Martin) are attending weekly swimming lessons at Abergavenny Leisure Centre.

Each lesson takes place on a Wednesday morning for ½ hour over this half term. During these lessons the Year 6 pupils are working towards achieving their WAG Certificate whilst the Year 5 pupils are working towards achieving their Confidence in water without a swimming aid, 5m and 25m certificates. Water safety sessions are also included during the 6 week block of lessons. The pupils are making excellent progress.
